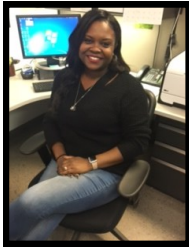


Our Featured Employee—Leah Jackson

Work Place Fire Protection: Tips in the Safe Use and Maintenance of Portable Heaters

It is best to purchase a heater with a tip-over switch. This feature allows the heater to turn off automatically when it is tipped over. Also, make certain that the heater has a guard over the heating element. The guard is usually seen in the form of a wire grill.

- Place the heater at least 11 feet away from a combustible material.
- Keep a fire extinguisher near every portable heater.
- Place the portable heater on the floor or on a location with secure footing and base.
- Always keep clothes, plastic, and other combustible materials away from the heater coils as they can instantly ignite.
- Ensure that the portable heater is plugged into properly grounded outlets.
- Keep and maintain a smoke detector with the heater.
- Avoid using extension cords with the portable heater.
- Make sure that the electrical cord is not exposed to the intense heat generated by the heater.
